

Director of Youth & Family

Reports to Senior Pastor

Job purpose

The Director of Youth and Family Ministry coordinates and nurtures faith formation for children and youth, ages 3 years-12th grade, and their families, by planning and coordinating weekly programs and special events. The Director oversees these areas in order to create a holistic approach to faith formation.

Duties and responsibilities

General Responsibilities:

- Work closely with the Senior Pastor to plan and lead the Youth Ministry and with the
 Deacon of Ministry to plan and lead the Family Ministry; works with the Congregation
 Council (specifically Education and Youth Commissioners), other staff and laypersons to
 develop the faith of youth and families.
- Form meaningful relationships with youth and families in the congregation and larger community
- Recruit and train leaders and volunteers for programming and events
- Effectively communicate with the youth and families about ongoing ministries, activities and events, using multiple forms of communication
- Effectively communicate with the congregation about activities and events of the Youth and Family Ministry, when appropriate
- Encourage participation in the life and programs of St. Paul Lutheran Church. Model faithful participation in worship and serve as an example of a devoted follower of Christ
- Attend staff meetings (as required) and occasional staff retreats; manage budgets; work with the Senior Pastor to set goals that are in line with St. Paul's vision
- Submit monthly Council Reports and an Annual Congregational Report
- Seek opportunities for spiritual and professional growth

Specific Duties:

- Facilitate, implement and schedule faith education opportunities, including curriculum selection for:
 - Vacation Bible School (in collaboration with Deacon of Ministry)
 - Sunday morning education opportunities for elementary/middle/high school youth
 - Confirmation (in collaboration with Senior Pastor)
- Develop, plan and implement faith formation activities for families (e.g., Family Camp, service opportunities and attend Wednesday Suppers)
- Develop, plan and implement faith formation activities for middle and high school youth (e.g., Youth Gatherings, recreational trips, service opportunities)
- Plan and promote fundraising activities to support youth and family ministry
- Plan and implement, (alongside Senior Pastor and Deacon of Ministry), faith milestones such as: 1st Bible presentation, 1st Communion, Confirmation, High School Graduation, Mission Trip Commissioning

- Work with staff and congregational leadership to integrate children and youth into the worship life of the congregation by encouraging worship participation and leadership (e.g. acolytes, assisting ministers, greeters)
- Partner with other congregations and community organizations, seeking joint ministry opportunities, as appropriate
- Contact and reconnect with inactive youth and families
- Promote and encourage Lutheran summer camps, colleges and campus ministries
- Perform other duties as assigned by Senior Pastor

Qualifications

Qualifications include:

- Bachelor's or Associate Degree
- Strong relational intelligence, interpersonal and communication skills with all ages
- Strong leadership skills including leader recruitment and training
- Strong work ethic and organizational skills
- Biblical and Lutheran theological understanding
- Ability to uphold the teachings and practices of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and a Reconciling in Christ congregation
- Demonstrated experience working with youth
- Hold a valid driver's license
- Must complete and pass background checks
- Must be 21 years or older

Working environment

- Requires some degree of flexibility in hours available for work, including evenings and weekends
- Ability to work remotely, as needed
- The Director of Youth and Family Ministry is encouraged to participate in various continuing education events in the fields of Children's, Youth and Family Ministry

Compensation

Full-time, \$40,000 annual salary, plus health insurance and continuing education
