#### **Construction & COVID Updates**

Navigating the dual challenges of construction and COVID are, well, challenging! We appreciate your patience and understanding as we adapt to ever-changing information. Please note these important updates:

#### **Building Access**

Building access remains restricted at this time. Notify Deacon Christine if you need to visit the building for any reason. Please note that the former Day Care Entrance (Door 2) will be used as the primary door for church business. The former Office Entrance (Door 3) will be used as the primary Day Care entrance. Offerings can continue to be dropped in the mailbox outside Door 3.

#### Parking

Construction fencing will be going up soon around our property. As site work begins, our parking lots will be unavailable for use and we will need to rely on street parking only. Please follow all posted signs regarding street parking (no parking on Ardmore and the north side of Washington Ave.). If you are able to do so, we encourage you to walk or ride your bicycle to church! We'll have designated parking for strollers as well.

#### No Accessible Entrance

Our lift has officially been decommissioned to make way for a new full-size elevator, so we do not have an accessible entrance to the church available at this time. If you require assistance to reach the sanctuary level for worship, please join us online.

#### In-Person Gatherings

In-person gatherings/meetings are permitted, and may take place in the sanctuary, front lawn, 536 Cornell, or private homes (backyards encouraged). All spaces, including the front lawn, must be reserved through <a href="Deacon Christine">Deacon Christine</a>. Leaders of each group are responsible for ensuring that St. Paul COVID protocol is followed.

#### **COVID Protocol**

At the direction of St. Paul's Health & Safety Task Force, face coverings continue to be required during our state's "Bridge" transition to Phase 5. Revised protocol will be released when that milestone is achieved. Everyone over the age of twelve is strongly encouraged to get vaccinated.




#### **Book Club**
