Community and World



Lombard/Villa Park Food Pantry Merger

The Outreach House, the Lombard/Villa Park Food Pantry and the First United Methodist Clothes Closet recently merged into one ministry under the name "The Outreach House." St. Paul has long supported the food pantry with financial gifts. Now, our contributions will also benefit these other great services:

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry distributes food to neighbors in Lombard and Villa Park four times a week. In the past three months the pantry has served an average of 375 individuals from 116 households each week and distributed a total of 116,000 pounds of fresh produce, protein, dairy and shelf stable foods. On average, 30 new families come in each month for food assistance.

First Things First

First Things First provides for the essential needs of children 0-3. It operates much like a food pantry, instead of distributing food, young families receive diapers, wipes, clothing for toddlers and infants, books and birthday bags. Families also receive information about available services (medical, early learning, WIC, etc.) and consultation to help young parents navigate their assistance options. First Things First distributed just over 7,000 diapers a month this summer.

Clothing Closet

The Clothes Closet provides clothes for children and adults, including maternity clothes, shoes and outerwear (during cold weather months).

Walk-In Ministry

Walk-In Ministry is more than just a provider of emergency financial assistance to local community members. It's a place where those in need can find a listening ear, a calm voice and some wise words when they're needed most. Many of us have experienced unexpected life circumstances and were helped by a helping hand...this is a big reason why we give back today. Walk-In Ministry provides help with gas, gift cards for medical prescriptions, emergency bills, food support (via Food Pantry), and consultation for specific needs.



Prairie Path Clean-Up

Volunteers from St. Paul helped clean-up the Great Western Prairie Path, a one mile stretch of 10,000-yearold native plants located in Elmhurst, in August. The day was hot, the giant ragweed was, well, giant!, but our smiles were big as we worked together alongside a wellcoordinated crew of volunteers to help maintain this beautiful section of our local community.
