ProJECT Forward Update




Book Club

You Can Be a Part of the Next In-Person Prayer Vigil

The last few St. Paul Prayer Vigils have been online, due to COVID restrictions and then the church building renovation project. The next Prayer Vigil is planned to be held in person on Friday, October 28.

The Prayer Vigil is a special time when members of our community join together in a continuous, individual, silent period of prayer from 7:00 am until 7:00 pm. Individuals come to the sanctuary for a 20-minute time slot (or longer, if they wish) to meditate, speak with, or just listen to God. While there may be others in the sanctuary with them, each person individually spends time with God. Outside the sanctuary, greeters are available to provide guidance and help participants feel comfortable. The idea is to have a continuous stream of prayer throughout the day.

There are two ways you can take part in this quiet, yet powerfully moving event. First, you are invited to come and pray with us during the Vigil. You can sign up for a particular time slot, or just show up when you can. If you haven't come to the Vigil before, no worries! A greeter will be glad to explain what to do when you arrive.

The second way you can participate is to join the Prayer Vigil Team. The Team is looking for new members to help with organizing, running, and publicizing the vigil to the congregation and to the neighboring community.
