Homecoming Weekend September 10-11


Join us as we gather for a weekend of events celebrating our community and the arrival of a new program year!

Did you know...25% of funds raised will benefit local food pantries with access to food through the Northern Illinois Food Bank. The money these pantries receive puts food



directly in the hands of those who need it most. Every \$1 donated helps provide \$8 worth of groceries for our community members. 75% of funds raised will benefit Church World Service programs and hunger initiatives in developing countries. Last year, the St. Paul team raised over \$1,750. The entire walk raised over \$25,000. Let's challenge ourselves and exceed that amount.


