First off, this is a glimpse into my reality as a pastor, as I have the privilege to walk with individuals, couples and families through major life events. But also...really?!? Weddings are (literally) a giant party, while funerals are a somber gathering (or so I thought). Having presided over dozens of weddings and countless more funerals, I must say this advice was quite accurate. While I love working with couples in planning their "big day", I cannot help but find a much deeper and profound connection planning a day to celebrate their loved one.

I find myself writing about funerals because soon enough we'll be gathering to celebrate All Saints Day. A day where we ring bells, light candles and read the names of those who have died in this past year. It is simultaneously a difficult day of remembrance as well as a celebration of the people who we have loved in this life. The greatest joy of the day is in the name itself "All Saints", wherein we are reminded that no matter how complex and complicated our lives and relationships may be, that in God's eyes we are all saints. Being a saint is not reliant on the miraculous, but quite the contrary, revealed in the mundane. It is in our day-to-day lives that we share ourselves with others. Relationships are formed and memories are made. Perhaps that is what I appreciate most about my work accompanying the dying and bereaved, sharing in the stories of life. Reflecting on the memories of what was, while finding comfort in the knowledge of what will be in the resurrected life. I am blessed in my vocation and continue to give thanks for all of the saints at St. Paul.






Wine Women and the Word

God's Work, Our Hands. Lutheran Social Services of Illinois Foster Care Program. Tim Frakes

Lindsey Clark decided she wanted to adopt children when she was in high school. "The marriage part never happened and the older I got the more I was like, "Okay, I can't control that, but I can control the adoption part" Lindsey explained. As she researched adoption, Lindsey learned about the pressing need for foster care in Illinois. "The fear of what could happen was not a good enough reason to say no to that need," said Lindsey. That realization led her to Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI), one of the largest statewide social service providers representing the three Illinois synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

The main goal of LSSI's Foster Care Program is to help children who are often abused or neglected find their forever home, either by reunification with birth families whenever possible or through adoption. Foster parents play a key role and make a difference in the lives of these children.

Today Lindsey is a single foster parent with two preschool children in her small Naperville apartment. The kids are doing well and Lindsey is often run ragged. When asked what she would do if her time with the children ended due to family reunification Lindsey said, "It would be really difficult. But I need to be willing to have my heart broken so that their hearts can have a chance to heal." To those who support LSSI through their financial support Lindsey simply says, "Thank you. You probably will never see the difference you are making, but it is there."
